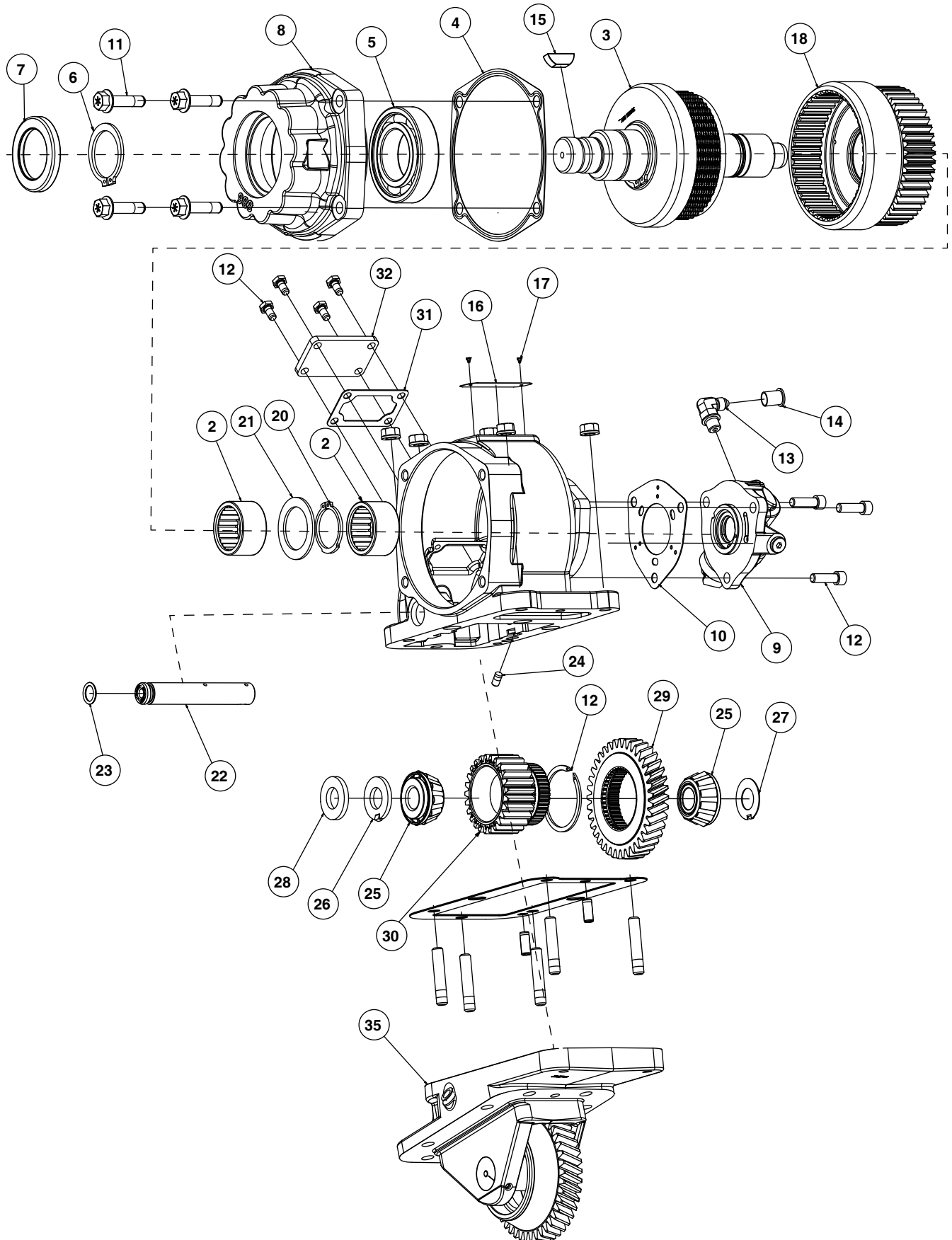

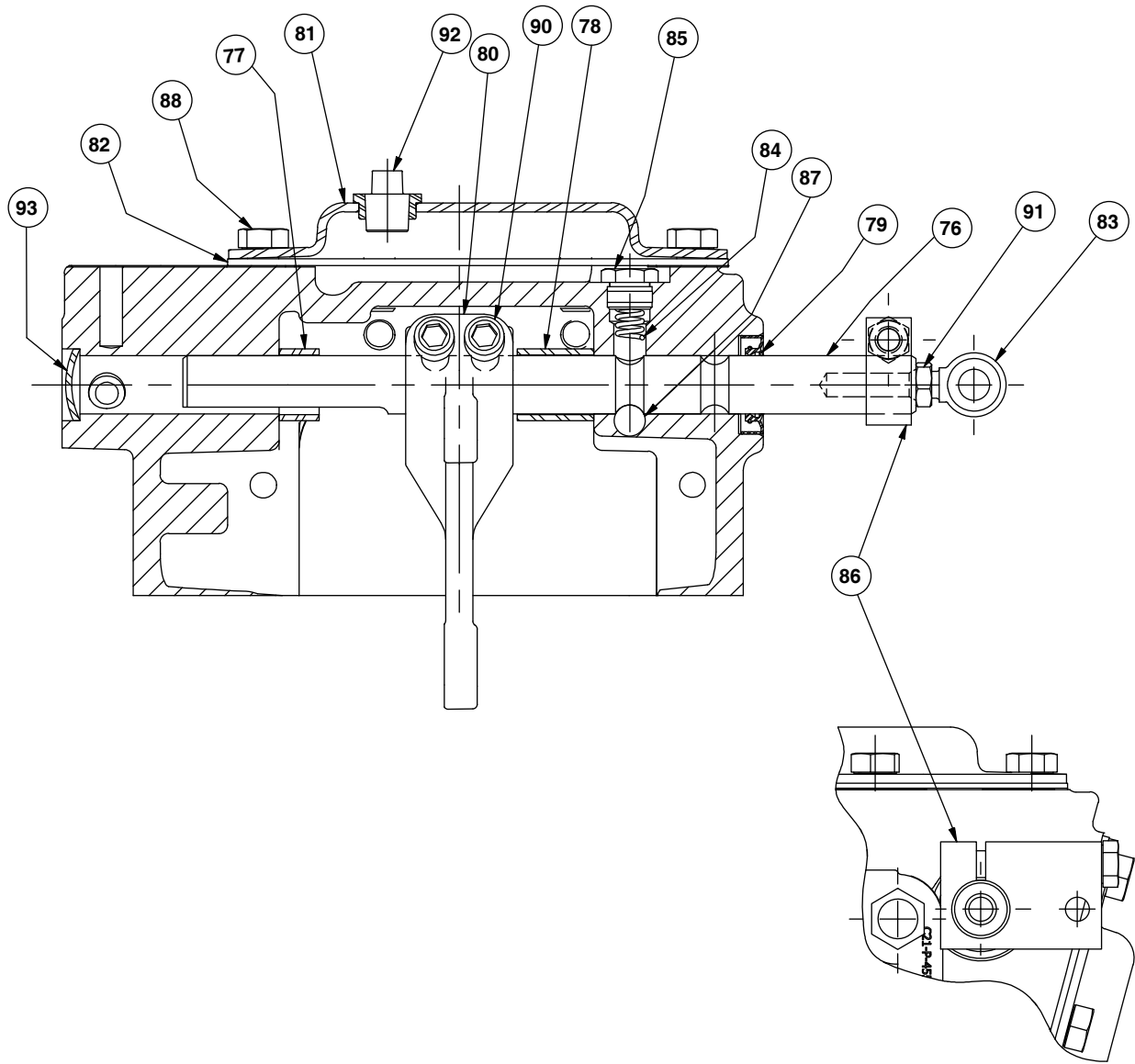

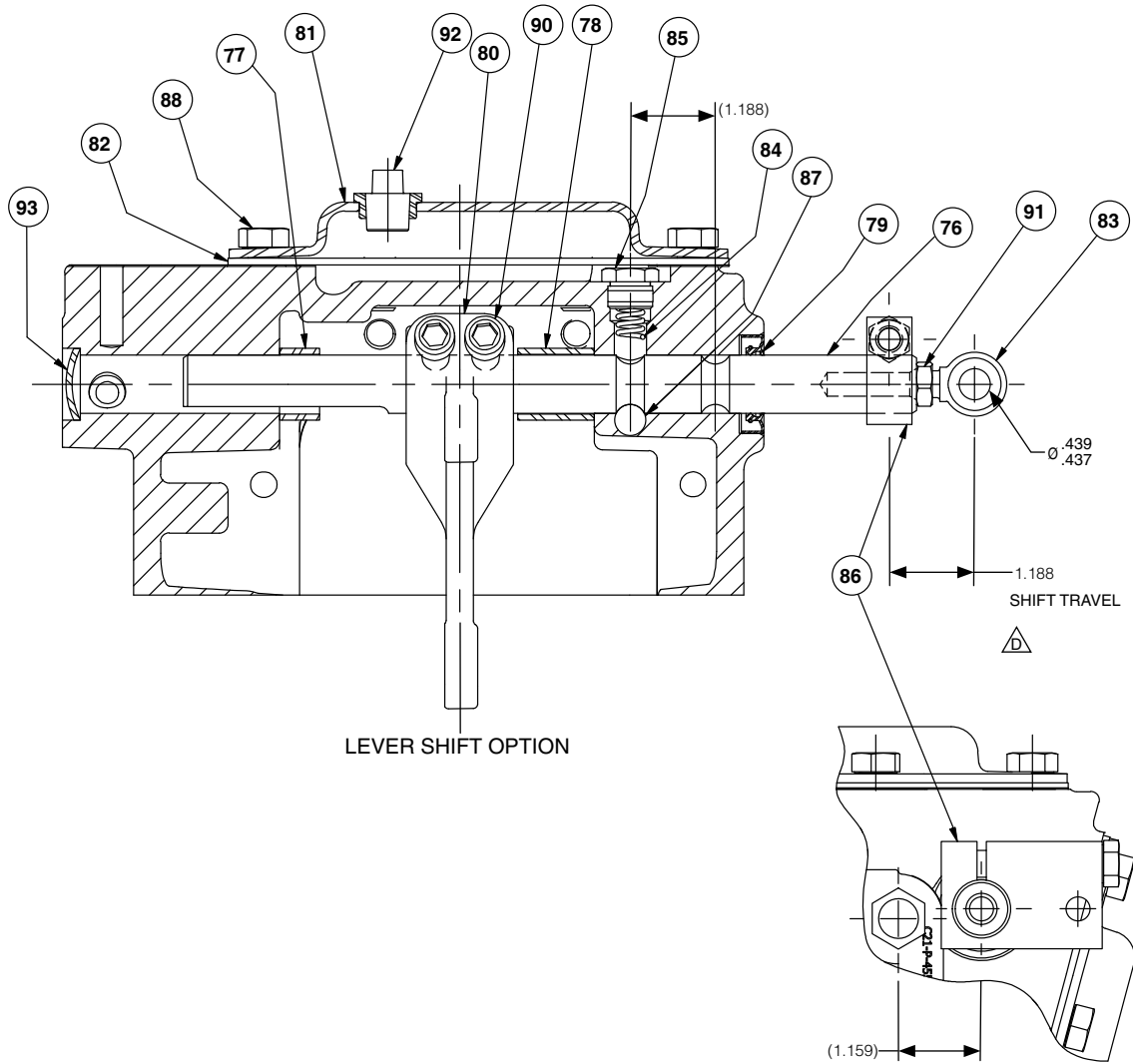

I then placed the numbers for the parts list. This was challenging because the numbers could not change size while the drawing was now smaller.

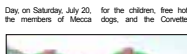
